

What will you choose to do?

- Look at photographs at home of yourself or family members at the seaside. Are there any of someone swimming in the sea? Can you find the location of the seaside on a UK or world map?
- Make a miniature seashore garden using natural materials, such as pebbles, twigs, sand and shells.
- Make a list of all the activities you could do at the seashore. Survey your friends and family to identify the 'Top five seashore activities' and display the results in a pictogram or bar chart.
- Design, draw and paint a picture of a beach hut.
- Visit your local library to browse or borrow story and information books about the seaside. Write or film a book review about your favourite.
- Investigate what happens to different materials when they are in saltwater. Make a salty solution and then use it to half-fill a number of jars. Put a different material into each jar and observe what happens over time. Can you create the motion of waves each day? What has happened to each material after a week?
- Choose a story with a coastal setting to read (e.g. The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch by Rhonda Armitage). Can you draw a story map to retell the key events from the story? Write a caption for each picture that you draw. Include and label the following events on your page: beginning, build up, problem, how the problem is solved, ending.
